 - He bought male and female slaves, owned herds of flocks (Ecclesiastes 2:7)
 - He gathered for himself silver and gold and the treasure of kings and provinces (Ecclesiastes 2:8a)
 - He got himself singers and many concubines (Ecclesiastes 2:8b)
 - He became great and surpassed all who were before him (Ecclesiastes 2:9)
